Re: AB 957—opposed

Dear California Senators,

I am Dr. Laura Haynes, California psychologist, and Board Member and USA Country Representative writing for the International Federation for Therapeutic and Counselling Choice that serves professionals in California and about 27 nations. We urge you to vote NO on AB 957.

AB 957 would take gender incongruent children away from parents because of parents' religious beliefs. This is overreach.

Governments that previously were world leaders in gender affirming treatments are now moving away from that and prioritizing psychotherapy. They are saying incongruent gender identity may reflect the temporary search for identity typical of the developmental state of adolescence and may subside. These children need their parents.

These governments are also saying young people who have psychiatric conditions may be more predisposed to develop incongruent gender identity, and they need psychiatric treatment, not gender treatment.

These governments include liberal and tolerant nations. They are Sweden,<sup>1</sup> <sup>2</sup> <sup>3</sup> Finland,<sup>4</sup> England,<sup>5</sup> <sup>6</sup> <sup>7</sup> Norway,<sup>8</sup> France,<sup>9</sup> and Italy,<sup>10</sup>, Australia, and New Zealand,<sup>11</sup> and they are growing. Health authorities in America and California are outliers. Worldwide, there is not a professional consensus that supports taking children away from religious parents for gender affirmation.

Under AB 957, politicians would place many religious California parents under threat—Catholic, Protestant, Jewish, Muslim, Mormon, Buddhist, and more. California parents will not be happy with politicians who place them under threat of taking away their children.

Don't let AB 957 happen. Vote NO.
